

NO TO £18.8M CUTS TO JOBS AND SERVICES IN NOTTINGHAM CITY COUNCIL

UNISON IS OPPOSED TO THE CUTS BEING MADE BY NOTTINGHAM CITY COUNCIL.

The Council's budget targets cuts at Children Centres and Services for Adults with Disabilities. It closes the Radford Unity Complex and cuts funding to the Council for Equality and Human Rights.

The cuts will not only threaten jobs, but also the welfare of some of Nottingham's most vulnerable people. Cutting services for People with Learning Disabilities, closing the Riverside Residential Home, reducing Day Care for People with Learning Disabilities and the introduction of a £2 daily charge for all Day Care Users are completely unacceptable.

Many economists are predicting up to 15% budget cuts over the next 3 years, potentially threatening up to 170,000 (10%) of the current 1.7 million jobs in local government, not to mention the impact this will have on local communities. All of this whilst the Government have been prepared to bail out the banking system by a staggering £1.2 trillion, they are expecting vulnerable people and public sector workers to pick up the bill for the public deficit that this bail out has caused.

Following on from the protest outside the Council House on the 8th March, Nottingham City Unison is organising a series of meetings for its members and the public, to discuss the impact of these cuts and develop an on going campaign against these and future cuts in local government.
